SECTION “H” - JUNIOR CLASSES

For classes 138 to 145 please indicate the degree of parental support. When safety is a priority, we expect appropriate adult support, but the creative part should be entirely the child's work.

Please ensure entry forms are received by 6.00pm on the Monday prior to the show and that the entry is delivered to the show marquee by 9:45 on show day.

If you are unsure of anything to do with staging your exhibit, please ask either a Steward or Show Secretary.

Please remember to remove exhibits between 4.30 and 5.00 pm. Otherwise, exhibits may be damaged or lost.

Class 135 – Ask The Storybots Theme Song:

RULES FOR EXHIBITORS (No floral foam (oasis))

1. Entry forms must reach the Show Secretary by 6.00pm on the Monday prior to the show. Additional entry forms may be sent on plain paper. A separate sheet must be used for each exhibitor.
2. Exhibits must be staged between 7.45am and 9.45 am on the day of the summer show. Exhibit cards will be supplied by the Show Secretary and must be placed in front of the exhibits. Exhibitors must leave the tent by 9.45 am. And no person may be in the tent while judging is in progress, unless an official.
3. When exhibits have been staged, they may be moved only by a Steward. After judging they must not be altered or taken away before 4.30 pm. After 4.30 pm., exhibits and cards may be removed.
4. Not According to Schedule: Any exhibit which, when judged, does not conform to the wording of the Schedule, may be disqualified and the entry card marked N.A.S.
5. No exhibitor may make more than one entry in each class except for classes 65 & 68 collections of fruit or vegetables.
6. Exhibits, except plants, will not be included in the judging if they have been exhibited in a previous L&DCGS Show. All handicraft entries (Sections F and H) should have been completed within the last year.
7. Gardens of exhibitors in the Horticultural Classes shall be open for inspection by the judges at a prearranged time.
8. The judges may withhold any prize should they consider that there is no exhibit of sufficient merit.
9. Any protest or objection must be made in writing and handed to the Show Secretary before 3.00 pm. On the day of the Show. The Committee shall consider any infringement of the Rules whether brought to its attention by a protest or not. The Committee's decision on any point shall be final.
10. All exhibits must be the property/work of the exhibitor. Plants must have been in exhibitor's possession for a minimum of three months. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
11. Decisions made by the judges shall be final.
12. Whilst every reasonable care will be taken of exhibits, the Society shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits or any other property in the Show Tent.
13. All classes are open to anyone (within stated limitations)
14. Sweet Peas and Rose Classes – support of bloom is allowed.
15.
 - a) Class 75 – Collection of Vegetables must be shown on a tray or cloth not exceeding 500 mm square.
 - b) No plates to exceed 300 mm in diameter.
 - c) No plant pot to exceed 250 mm in diameter except where specified.
 - d) Pot Plant – for show purposes, a plant grown in a pot for decorative effect of its foliage, flower or fruit.

- e) A vase is a vessel for displaying cut flowers in water and having a greater height than width measurement at its mouth.
 - f) A bowl is a vessel for displaying cut flowers in water having a greater diameter at its mouth than its height.
 - g) No floral foam (oasis)
There are many alternative ideas to support cut flowers, e.g. cucumbers, tightly packed moss in chicken wire which can be moulded into shape, a grid made of compostable tape on top of the vase, filling the vase with stiffer foliage, or you can search Google for eco-friendly alternatives and how to dispose of foam safely.
16. Jars or tops, with trade name of preserve suppliers, should have the name covered. It is permissible to have dots, marks and numbers, which are found on lower sides or base of jars. Date of making to be on label (e.g. dd/mm/yy).
 17. Unless otherwise stated in this Schedule, judging of the formal Horticultural Classes will be guided by the rules and standards contained in the Royal Horticultural Show Handbook, 2016, available from the Show Secretary.
 18. The Cups & Trophies remain the property of the Society and must be returned in a clean condition by the Saturday prior to the next Show, unless otherwise requested by the Committee. Prize monies not collected will be held by the Hon. Treasurer for one month and then will be treated as a contribution to funds at the Committee's discretion.

GUIDANCE FOR EXHIBITORS

Fruit & Vegetable

- Uniformity of size and shape is very important, the biggest may not be the best.
- All entries should be clean, root vegetables should be washed but never scraped or brushed.
- Beetroot, carrots & parsnips should be cut as to leave tops of leaves & stalks which should be tied.
- Rhubarb should have 3" of leaf remaining.
- Runner beans and dwarf beans should be shown with stalk attached.
- Tomatoes and courgettes shown with calyx attached.
- Onions and shallots should be ripe, firm & uniform with roots cut off, tops cut back and bound with raffia or string.
- Potatoes should be medium size for the cultivars and equally matched with no scabs, pests, diseases or deep eyes.
- Cabbages and cauliflowers should have solid heads of even size. Cauliflowers should have leaves cut back at the front.

Flowers (No floral foam (oasis))

Check the schedule carefully for the type of cultivars, colour, size and number of blooms required. In some classes extra foliage is allowed, otherwise use the flower's own foliage.

- Flowers should be fresh and fully developed, good quality blooms. They should be true to type, of good colour, well angled and evenly spaced on strong stems. Flowers and foliage should be free of blemishes.
- Choose a vase which is in proportion to the number and height of stems and display each bloom to advantage. Don't forget the water and remember the judge could pick up every vase. We can now offer exhibitors bikini vases.
- When exhibiting Sweet Peas, Roses, Dahlias and Gladioli, the variety should be displayed if known.

Floral Arrangements (see rules – no. 15)

- Arrangements should be displayed in water retaining material unless stated otherwise, no floral foam or oasis.
- An exhibit is plant material with or without accessories using fresh flowers & foliage unless stated otherwise.
- Materials may be bought.
- Exhibits must not exceed the size specified.

Home Produce

- Preserves - Use plain glass jars with NO commercial markings.
- State type of preserve and date of manufacture. Jams, marmalade or jellies – twist top or pliable press-on cover or waxed disc covered with cellophane top (when cold).
- Curds – pot size – max 250g. Cellophane cover no solid lids.
- Vinegar preserves – twist top with plastic lining or pliable press-on top. Must be at least 2 months old before exhibiting.
- No packet mixes should be used and no item displayed in the container in which it was cooked unless stated otherwise.

- Wine/cordials should be displayed in a plain glass bottle with an easily removable top and should be named and dated using a small adhesive label.
- Exhibitors to provide their own plates and a saucer if entered in class 129 – eggs.

Photography

- Classes are not open to professional photographers and exhibits must not have been bought or offered for sale and must have been taken by the exhibitor.
- Maximum size 300mm x 200mm and not mounted.

Handicraft section

- All exhibits not to have been previously shown.
- Handicrafts must have been completed in the previous year.

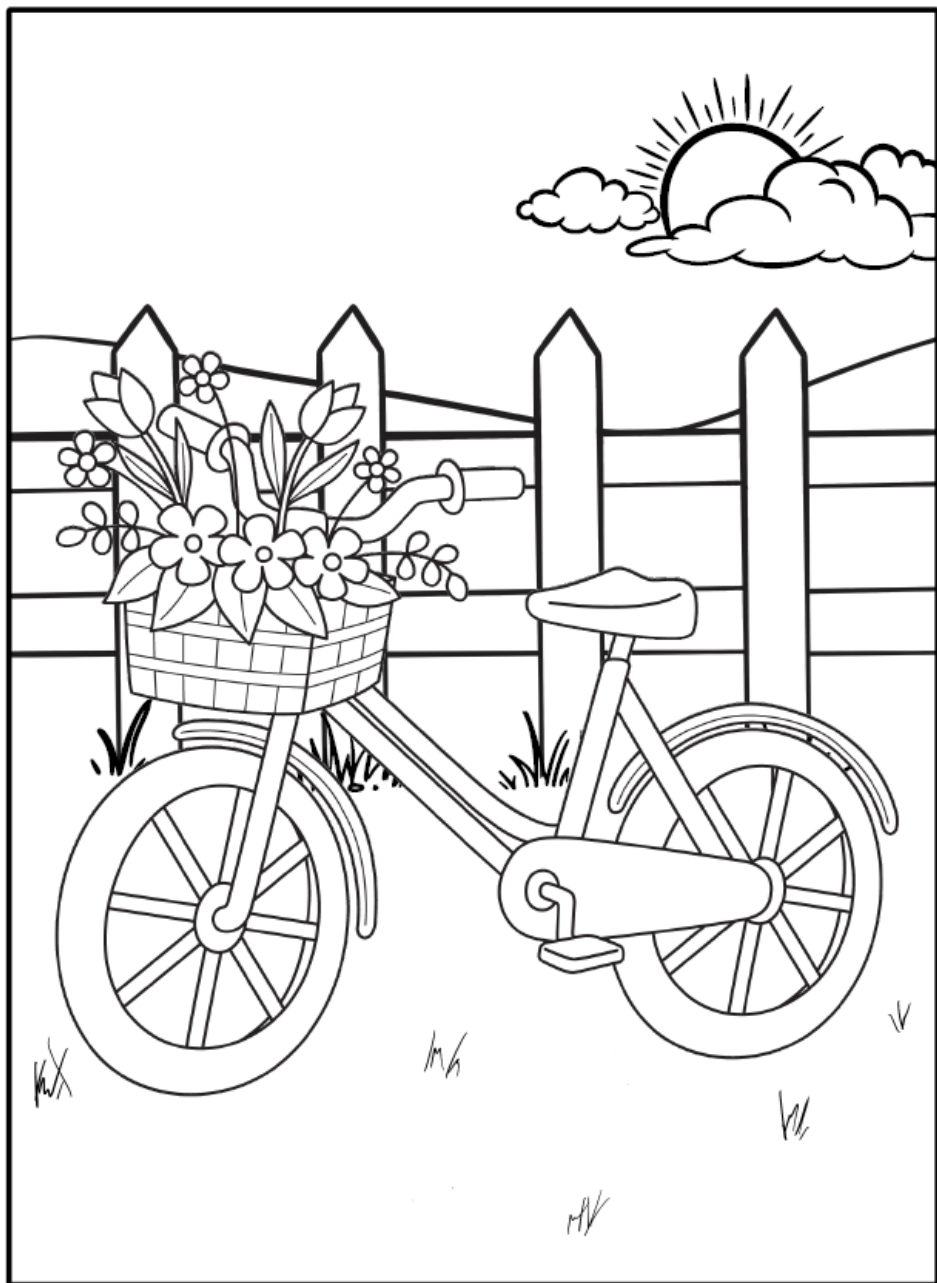
