### **Summer Show – 19<sup>th</sup> July 2025**

\_Looking back over my report from last year and it included a comment about the atrocious growing conditions. Similar can be said again but with different results.

Luckily all changed and conditions improved and we had a good number of entries.

The growing season was extended and many had bumper crops – “a mast year”.

We wish everyone good luck as the next couple of years might be very different.

Entries – we had several new and enthusiastic exhibitors which was encouraging and made a good show in the marquee. Our judges were delighted to see a good range of produce. We changed the marking process slightly as advised by our Chairman and it worked well and my thanks go to all the volunteer stewards. They have been invited back and I hope that they accept.

The most worrying thing is that so few children enter but those that do are very enthusiastic. The local schools have also found that time constrictions in their syllabus prevent them from putting in class entries. Out thanks go to the North Downs Betchworth base who overcame this and made a school entry in the writing class.

For the first time since 2022 we also had an Autumn Show – smaller but no less important and it was well supported as many had still good crops. Unfortunately, it clashed with the Newdigate show but we plan to hold an autumn show next year but on Sunday.
