TREASURERS REPORT L&CGS AGM-19 NOVEMBER 2024

I am very pleased to report that the Society achieved an outstanding result showing a surplus of £5677 an increase of £4595on the previous year.

Expenditure was very similar to 2023 but income increased by £4596. The quiz was very successful but of course the main difference was the summer show which produced a surplus of £5526.

Costs remained broadly the same but income increased by £4593, This can be attributed to various factors; The weather was very favourable, attendance was well up on previous years, The quality of the stalls and attractions continue to improve thanks to the sterling efforts of various committee members over a number of years.

All the above reasons are interrelated but they worked up to an outstanding show.

We now have reserves of over £16000 which will enable the society to look forward to the future with confidence.

Show Secretary Report 2024

Good Evening Ladies and Gentlemen.

This year's event was stupendous. The show is divided into two sections. The Field, which includes all the stalls, both outside and Cottage Garden Society and the attractions. This is the responsibility of Mark Dobell. He worked near miracles with the number and quality with the added problem of which car park would be available so had to draw up TWO sets of plans.

Paula worked her magic and drew together a wonderful selection of entertainers plus Graham, with the carparks. The main field was baled on Friday afternoon, a close call.

As Show Secretary I am responsible for the show marquee, the entries and exhibits. Those who know me will be aware that I will also have a say in other issues. Just to keep them on their toes.

This year the horticultural exhibits were good considering the atrocious growing weather early in the season. The staple crops for many were sadly lacking, beans and tomatoes to name just two.

The real elephant in the room were the exhibitor cards. Entries close on the Wednesday before the show and 60% of these arrive between 12 noon and 6.00pm

We have been trying to progress into the 21st century and so reduce the number of handwritten show cards and transfer to computer generated. For this we are in the early stages and this year was a disaster! Not due to our lack of knowledge but due to the www crashing! The plug was pulled in the USA by the company that had a monopoly.

Our fault was that we did not have a backup plan in place that we could initiate in time. I must thank Kerry for all her work on the original system and her sleepless night prior to the show.

A member of the Surrey Horticultural Federation offered other Societies help and advice which we have taken up. After much practice and the occasional curse, we have a working system. The one change for exhibitors is that to entries will close at 6.00pm on the Monday prior to the show. This will allow for any hic-ups beyond our control plus a back-up plan will be in place. I thank my sister Penelope, for her hours of work as she was determined not to be beaten by a computer!

The Summer Show 2025 is again quite early in the month – 19th July so we have agreed to run an Autumn Show on 6th September. For any newcomers this show is held in the Village Hall and is perfect for those who wish to try something new.

Membership update AGM 19th November 2024

I am happy to report our membership level has remained constant this year, with exactly the same number of members -103. The number of these who are patrons is about a third, and has risen slightly since last year.

The society is lucky to have loyal and supportive members, not only in Leighbut in the surrounding areas.

Once again the committee has taken the decision not to increase the cost of membership, which remains at £8 for membership and £15 to become a patron. There are lots of membership benefits — a varied and interesting programme of talks, garden visits to private gardens only open to members, as well as the discount on entering the Summer Show.

And we continue to offer discounts at a number of outlets, including the excellent Buckland Nurseries which always offers a great range of plants, the Hope Nursery now at Church Farm in Betchworth, and Paul Scroggin's local dog walking service. Sadly Bettahomes in Woodhatch which also offered a discount closed this year.
